# Sixth Form Bridging Event 2022

Over 190 students, including nearly 90 from other schools, attended the Sixth Form Bridging Event this week. It ran on Monday and Tuesday and gave Year 11 students a chance to gain some experience of what life as a Sixth Former is like, as well as get to know each other ahead of the next two years of their time at Becket Keys.

Over the two days, students took part in a carousel of eight group challenges aimed at developing different skills. Engineering activities included building a monument out of spaghetti and marshmallows with Miss Morgan, constructing a car to protect an egg in as it went down a ramp

with Mr Bunyan and creating a shelter to shield a cuddly toy during high-winds with Mr Hughes. There were also fierce debates and opportunities to demonstrate thinking skills during the 'Festival Challenge' overseen by Mr Ioannou, with more of the same in Miss Romano's 'Whodunnit?' as students donned their deerstalkers to solve a murder mystery. Meanwhile, teamwork was crucial in Mr Silver's 'Pieces of Eight' and communication skills were highlighted in Mr Pethers' 'Gibberish and Claptrap'. Finally, Pila Capere, which was managed by Mrs Moffat and Mrs Joughin, pulled all of these skills together with, erm, varied success.

Groups accumulated points for

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their success in each activity, plus bonus points for how well they worked together as group. These were combined with the scores from the current affairs quiz to give total scores across the two days. At the end of it all, the final standings were revealed as:

Tutor groups (8 in total): 3rd – Heidelberg with 300 points 2nd – Salamanca with 306 points 1st – Jagiellonian with 316 points.

Competition groups (40 in total): 3rd – Heidelberg 2 with 65 points 2nd – Bologna 2 with 66 points Joint 1st – Jagiellonian 3 and Jagiellonian 5 with 68 points.



As well as these activities, a series of talks were attended over the two days. The content of these meant that students left knowing a lot more about what life will be like as a Sixth Form student, what they can do to get ready for their new studies in September and how they will be supported on GCSE results day as they enrol. During this time, they were introduced to the interesting Bridging Activities to complete over the summer and recommendations of how to

enrich their studies by enjoying wider reading materials, places to visit, documentaries, films, TV shows and podcasts.

Students also shared periods of Collective Worship in order to reaffirm their understanding of the central roles that the Christian Faith and strong moral values play in the Sixth Form.



Between all of this, students got to experience the Sixth Form area for the first time and enjoy the fare served at the Deli Bar. As always, this was a hit as students relished being in what still feels like a brand-new part of the school, feeling comfortable in different rooms and devouring the variety of tasty food and drink now available to them. Naturally, the sweet treats at break on both days went down very well indeed!

The highlight of the two days was, as ever, the clear display of our community's values by all students, including those who came from different schools. This is something that should never be taken for granted and it filled staff with great pride to see such responsible, caring students who are clearly going to be

remarkable members of the Sixth Form.



The next stage of the 'bridging process' involves each student completing the Bridging Activities for the subjects they will be taking at A Level. Each of these comprises of varied learning activities lasting at least ten hours per subject and is designed to create more interest in future studies, broaden students' knowledge of topics and keep students' brains ticking over during this long summer that they can now enjoy.

There are well over 300 students who have applied to and been offered a place in the Sixth Form. As nearly 190 students have said that Becket Keys is their first choice destination, there is clear evidence of the growth in our popularity in such a short space of time!



We wish all these – and other Year 11 students who are planning on going to college elsewhere – a fun summer. We hope that they make the most of the long holiday to try new activities, challenge their minds without the pressures of exams and enjoy a thoroughly well deserved chance to relax after working so hard throughout the year.



# Book of the Month - June



A new fast-paced thriller about two sisters vying for the top spot on their cross-country team—until a teammate's disappearance throws their lives off course. Stella and Ellie Steckler are only a year apart, but their different personalities make their relationship complicated. Stella is single-minded, driven, and she keeps to herself. Cross-country running is her life and she won't let anything get in the way of being the best. Her sister Ellie is a talented runner too, but she also lets herself have fun. She has friends. She goes to parties. She has a life off the course. The sisters do have one thing in common, though: the new girl, Mila Keene. Both Stecklers' lives are upended when Mila comes to town. At first, Ellie and Stella view the new star athlete as a threat. But soon Ellie can't help but be drawn to her warm, charming personality. After her best friend moved away and her first boyfriend betrayed her, Ellie's been looking for a friend to share her secrets. Stella finds herself noticing the ways she and Mila are similar. Mila is smart and strong—she's someone Stella can finally connect with. As the two get closer, Stella becomes something she vowed she'd never be: distracted. With regionals approaching and college scouts taking notice, the pressure is on. Each girl has their future on the line and they won't let friendships get in their way. But then, suddenly, Mila goes out on a training run and never returns. No one knows what happened, but all eyes are on the Steckler

This novel is also a thoughtful examination of socio-economic challenges, the impact of crushing personal secrets, and the ways female athletes suffer under the weight of misogyny, especially when they are aggressively competitive.

# PAUSE Stay connected to fruitful living


As creatures of habit, we tend to go through life on autopilot. We often miss clues that indicate that our spirit is not enjoying the good health that God created it for. Before Jesus went to the cross, he gave his followers these instructions: "Live in me, and I will live in you. A branch cannot produce any fruit by itself. It has to stay attached to the vine. In the same way, you cannot produce fruit unless you live in me" (John 15:4).

Jesus says that being spiritually connected is like being attached to a vine. You are not going to have any fruitfulness or productivity in your life if you are out there on your own. You have got to stay connected. A disconnected branch cannot bear fruit.

What kind of fruit should you produce when you are connected to the Body of Christ? "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23).

Below are the nine attributes of a person living according to the Fruits of the Spirit:





Love	"Love is patient, love is kind. Love is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails."  1 Corinthians 13: 4-7
Joy	"Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice!" Philippians 4:4
Peace	"Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid."  John 14-27
Patience	"The Lord is slow to anger and rich in kindness." Exodus 34:6
Kindness	"Be kind to one another and forgive each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you."  Ephesians 4:32
Goodness	"Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."  Matthew 5:16
Faithfulness	"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."  John 3:16
Gentleness	"Brothers and sisters, if someone is caught in a sin, you who live by the Spirit should restore that person."  Galatians 6:1
Self-control	"Make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance."  2 Peter 1: 5-7

These fruits of the Spirit are evidence that you are spiritually connected. If you are not seeing yourself grow in all these things, you are not spiritually connected. To have these attributes, we must walk with the Spirit. Indeed, this is what helps produce all nine of the qualities listed. When we

follow the Spirit's lead, instead of being led by our self-focused desires, He produces the fruit. Even when we are not walking with the Spirit, He is the one who guides us to restore order in our lives. God promises that if we are willing to admit that we have been walking our own way and

ask for His forgiveness, He will empower us through His Spirit to live above ourselves and live the abundant life for which He has created us.

Consider your responses to the following questions:

- Am I actively depending on the Holy Spirit to guide me in God's ways?
- What is the evidence in your life that you are bearing fruit?
- In what "fruits" do you need to grow? How are you going to do that?
- What benefits have you witnessed in your life from being connected to Christ?

# Let us pray:


Dear Father, however we are treated by other people, we pray that Your love will shine forth from us. Whatever happens in our lives, we ask that Your peace and joy would abide within us.
