



Mrs Trebess writes....

Memory and Learning



This week, I delivered the first in a series of Collective Worships aimed at improving the learning of students at Becket Keys. This year, we are focused on making our excellent teaching even better: not just in terms of what we teach (The Curriculum), but how we teach it. We are keen to share these methods with students and parents. There is scientific evidence to support the strategies that we are focusing on this year.

We all have a working memory and a long-term memory. The working memory is like a post-it note. It is temporary and gets lost easily! The long-term memory is like a hard drive. More information can be stored here for a longer period of time (potentially forever - I would imagine that some of you can still recite poetry or Shakespeare from your school days!). In order to retain information, it must be transferred to the long-term memory.

Forgetting is an important aspect of learning. The more times you can return to information, having thought you had forgotten it, the more it will be retained in your

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long-term memory. This concept can be illustrated by the graph at the top of this page.

What does this mean for students? During lessons, teachers are going to make sure that we revisit topics at strategic intervals, to enable students to recall and remember information they might otherwise have forgotten.

It is also important for students to independently get into the habit of revisiting topics at home, so that they are remembering what they have learned and are improving their brain fitness. As parents, you can of course support by helping sons and daughters to organise this, prompting them to revisit topics at timely intervals and perhaps even testing them around the dinner table! Our website publishes our curriculum so that you can see what students in different year groups are learning now and what they have learnt previously in each subject.

What is House Music?

- This is a music competition between the six houses at Becket Keys.

I look forward to inspiring the new generation of student and a prosperous career in teaching.




Miss Davies Spanish Teacher



Work experience placements, even if they only last for a few days, or a week or two, are a great way for you to open your eyes to the world of professional work.




Lord of the harvest – Putting God in his place

Jesus refers to God as '*the Lord of the harvest*' (Matthew 9:38). How do you reflect God's bounty in your everyday life?

The words of Matthew 9:35-38 have helped me reflect on the significance of God in our lives this harvest season:

"Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.""

It is not the actual context or the content of these verses that I would like to focus on today, but the title '*Lord of the harvest*'. The symbolic meaning of harvest in Scripture encompasses two main areas: God's provision for us and God's blessing for others. While we celebrate a harvest season just once a year, we must recognise that we experience the spirit of harvest all the time. Each day that we go to school or work



and feel that we have achieved, we experience harvest. Each time we receive love from our family and those in our lives, we experience harvest. Each time we experience the closeness of God in a way that fills us spiritually, we experience harvest. Each time we enjoy a good meal, we experience harvest. On a daily basis, we experience harvest!

The words of Jesus in this reading are important in helping us understand the way we should live our lives as '*workers*' for God. We must remember that the harvests we experience on a daily basis do not actually belong to us. They belong to God, because he is the 'Lord of the harvest', not us. When we put God in his place, his rightful place, we recognise him as the Lord of our harvest. We acknowledge that he is the one who gave us hands to work, that he is the one who supplies our provisions and that our family is actually his family. All these things rightfully belongs to Him.

In addition, when recognising that our harvest belongs to him, we also embrace the fact that,

while in part our harvest is something he gives to meet our needs, it is also something he wants us to use to bless others. These things exist, to a large extent, to be a blessing to those around us.

Our Harvest Foodbank Appeal is an example of how we can reach out and share our harvest, as God intended. Our donations to the foodbank over the years have brought hope and show that we care for the plight of the people of our local community.

We should also extend our thoughts to the issues of poverty all over the world and pray for God to help us support all these people. We are blessed with so many good things, but, there are some people who have none of these things. Perhaps their harvest has failed, or wicked people have taken away all the things that made their lives good, or they have suffered disease, famine, war or natural disasters, such as floods and hurricanes. Let us ask God to help us share what

we can with those who are in need.

We should also pray for the organisations which help people who have nothing to start making a living for themselves. Where we are unable to give in the material sense, may we be safe in the knowledge that our prayers can make a difference. Faith can move the mountains of injustice and poverty in this world.

This harvest season, pause for a time of reflection and ask, do I need to put God in his place this harvest season?

Let us pray:

Lord of the Harvest, we thank you for providing for us and our many blessings. Give us a harvest of peace, sown in justice, that everyone may have daily bread and that we can see our way forward in prayer. Be with us, Lord, as we face your challenge to help others and learn how to live our lives in love and prayer. Each day may we make the choices and take the actions that will

bring an end to poverty and hunger, and lead us all towards a fairer world. Amen.
