I have had a King Charles inspired breakthrough! I have been wondering what to call the green space next to the playground since we created it when the old sports hall was demolished. This week, I think I have found an answer!

Whilst preparing for the on-line whole school collective worship about the Coronation on Tuesday, I was reflecting on what the school could do to mark the occasion. As part of what we have been teaching the students about King Charles this week we have been explaining what a keen gardener and environmentalist he is.

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school to visit and plant a tree. At the time, we purchased a tree in readiness for this. As it turned out, he never came but we planted the tree anyway!

It has occurred to me this week that we could build on this meagre start and name the green space 'The Coronation Garden' and we could do a lot more than just plant a tree. How about some lavender bushes being planted? What about some bedding plants in the shape of a crown? What a lovely way to commemorate the school's on-going development and this key moment in our history.



Of course, this will take some money. I wondered if any families would like to join me in sponsoring this development to the garden. I propose that all of us who are willing contribute either £25 or 2.5 hours of gardening time in return for having our names recorded on a sign or plaque in the garden to forever more mark our investment in our school. 
Homework Club is available for all students.

MASSOLIT

Video Essay Competition 2023

This is the third MASSOLIT Video Essay Competition in partnership with <u>Brasenose College</u>, Oxford.

All UK-based students in Years 10, 11 and 12 are invited to create a "MASSOLIT-style" video lecture running at around 8-12 minutes on any academic topic. Entries open from Wednesday 1st March 2023 and the final deadline is 5pm Friday 30th June 2023.

The best entries will be reviewed by a panel of judges made up of academics from Brasenose and members of the MASSOLIT team.

This competition is open to every pupil in the UK – you do not need to be a subscriber to MASSOLIT. If you want to see what a "MASSOLIT-style" lecture is, please check out <u>our YouTube</u> channel.

What we're looking for: We'd like you to research, write and create a short (8-12 minute) lecture on a topic of your choice.

Your lecture should be 'talking head' style, like all the lectures on MASSOLIT, though you should feel free to make use of props (e.g. quoting from a book, playing some music, demonstrating a concept with props, etc.) if you feel it adds to your explanation.



Then again, if your lecture doesn't include any props, that's also fine!

Entries will be judged on:

Creativity

The educational value of the lecture – does the viewer learn something interesting and unexpected?

The clarity and concision of the script – is the material structured in a logical way?

Confidence and clarity of delivery – is the speaker looking at the camera? Are they speaking loudly and clearly?

The production quality of entries will not be judged, so please don't worry about what you shoot your video on, and please don't waste any time on post-production.





On 6th May 2023, in a ceremony rooted deeply in British history, King Charles III will be crowned at Westminster Abbey, eight months into his reign! The delay reflects the importance of this event as well as the time needed to organise this grand ceremony and invite people from around the world. The British monarch is the Head of State of the United Kingdom and 14 other countries (through being the Head of the Commonwealth). He is also the Supreme Governor of the Church of England and the Head of this Church, under God. The Most Reverend and Right Honourable Justin Welby, The Archbishop of Canterbury, will lead the coronation service.

The Coronation service will contain Christian symbolism. The consecration to service for King Charles III will happen within a Eucharist/Holy Communion. In addition, the ring he will receive is marked with a cross. This is a reminder of the King of Kings in whose footsteps he follows. The rod he will receive is topped with a dove; the symbol of the Holy Spirit, whose wisdom he will need to rule well. The orb represents the earth and is crowned with a

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cross. This is again a reminder that Jesus is the ultimate king. In addition, the oil with which he will be anointed with also symbolises the Holy Spirit. This is a prayer that God will anoint and equip the King to serve the nation.

The Liturgy for the service is focussed on the theme of loving service to others, which is central to Christian teaching, and to the character of contemporary Monarchy:

This version of the service contains a commentary that further explains the Christian meaning and symbolism of the key elements of the service.

It can be seen that this service will be an opportunity for the nation and many around the world to encounter the person of Jesus, the servant King. There is also a call to each of us to serve others and build relationships. Archbishop Justin Welby has stated:

"It is my prayer that all who share in this service, whether they are of faith or no faith, will find ancient wisdom and new hope that brings inspiration and joy."

Throughout the Coronation long weekend, volunteering will be celebrated, recognising its positive impact on communities. What will you be doing to be part of the lasting legacy of this special event? If you are not already involved in 'The Big Help

Out', remember, simple acts of kindness for others and the environment make a difference. All emphasise community cohesion and service.

Let us pray:

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, bless our Sovereign Lord, King Charles, and all who are in authority under him; that they may order all things in wisdom and equity, righteousness and peace, to the honour of your name,

and the good of your Church and people; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

Parkrun is 5k and takes place every Saturday morning. Junior Parkrun is 2k, dedicated to 4-14 year olds, and their families, every Sunday morning.

Parkrun is positive, welcoming and inclusive, there is no time limit and no one finishes last!





Everyone is welcome to come along.

Parkrun is free and you only need to <u>register once</u> whether walking, jogging, running, volunteering or a combination.

There are currently 1,163 parkrun events around the country taking place every weekend, with more locations being added all the time.
