I am writing today to let you know that as this academic year comes to a close, we are losing three much-loved teachers. Mr Peggs, Mr Fish and Mr Sibaja.

Mr Peggs has been with us since 2015 and held the position of Head of English before joining the Senior Leadership Team as an Assistant Head Teacher and Head of Sixth Form. Mr Peggs has been a very popular and successful English teacher enabling students from across the ability ranges to develop their skills in Language and Literature and gain confidence in this most important of subjects.

As Head of English, he led the school through its first ever

English exams and ensured that English progress here has always been much higher than national figures.

Mr Peggs also went on to break new ground in helping us to open our Sixth Form. Leading on shaping the culture, he has led with a passion for academic excellence and strong character.







# Free School Meal Vouchers Summer Holiday

Further funding for Free School Meal vouchers for the Summer break 2023 has been allocated by the local authority. As with previous holidays, we will be using the school voucher system, Wonde, to issue vouchers.

Parents and carers of eligible students will have received an email from Wonde to allow them to claim a voucher for £75 for this period. Please check your junk mail if you have not received this. The email will contain a link to 'redeem a voucher'. You will be taken to Wonde's 'evouchers' page (previously named Schoolvouchers), where you will need to enter your details and confirm your email address before being asked to select the retailer you wish to receive a voucher for.

The current retailers available are Asda, Aldi, B&M, Farmfoods,

M&S, Iceland, Morrisons,
Sainsburys, Waitrose and Tesco.
You will then be given a PIN and
the option to view the voucher.
Having confirmed the PIN, you
will be issued your voucher. The
voucher barcode can be printed
off or scanned on a smartphone
for use in-store.

### Student Achievement Oscar Smith Year 10

Last weekend I attended my Paddlesport Instructor course through the British Canoeing Awarding Body, which is the national governing body for UK paddlesports. I passed and became one of the youngest paddlesports instructors in the UK.



# What is a Paddlesport Instructor?

It is a qualification given out by British Canoeing allowing you to teach and lead paddling sessions in very sheltered waters on/in stand up paddleboards, kayaks and canoes.

This was something I started back in October of last year. The first course in the syllabus is the Foundational Safety and Rescue Training which consisted of a day of learning the fundamental skills of safety in and by the water along with the knowledge of rescues ranging from unattended crafts in the water to capsized crafts with unconscious/entrapped casualties.



At the beginning of July, I began my eLearning for the main course which consisted of the principles of instruction and leadership, along with diversity and inclusion within the sport.

Then on the 8th of July, I travelled to Stratford-upon-Avon to undertake the bulk of the course which lasted the whole weekend. On day one we covered all the theory of the course before heading out on the water to show our personal skills and confidence on/in our crafts. Although on the course we chose one craft to perform and be assessed on, we had to show our confidence and skill in all three of the main crafts.

We ended the day with assessments of our skills in the rescue of unconscious and entrapped paddlers. Finally, we were given homework for the next day which was to plan a 20-minute session that we would

lead as a part of the following day's assessments.





On day two we headed straight out onto the water. Starting with the homework for my session I decided to teach confidence of moving around a paddleboard. We then moved on to how to plan and run expeditions and journeys on the water. Heading into the afternoon we finished with our final rescue assessments which included deep water rescues, selfrescues, and rescuing of a swimmer. At the end of the day, we had a one-to-one debrief with the course provider to talk about our next steps and how to further our scope of practice in the sport.

# Student Achievement Christian Ludwig Year 7




Christian Ludwig has received the Jack Petchey Award for 'Outstanding Achiever' through his nomination from Brentwood Swimming Club.

Christian has worked extremely hard in training attending many sessions throughout the week before and after school.


Swimming is a sport that requires extremely dedicated participants and training takes place throughout the year.


Christian is now planning on focusing his training over the next six months to improve his times in order to be eligible to qualify for Essex County and East Regional competitions.












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
