

A-Level Results 2023



During the summer, Becket Keys Church of England School students and staff were celebrating the school's best set of A level examination results. This year, we have seen more students getting As and A*s and more students getting into their first-choice university than ever before. The school has students heading off to a wide range of interesting and prestigious destinations.

GCSE Results 2023


Becket Keys Church of England School celebrated another set of excellent GCSE results. Students in the 2023 cohort have achieved the highest results the school has ever seen with more students than ever before achieving Grades 4-9 in both English and Mathematics. In addition, a record number of students were entered for and passed the Ebacc.

There are a number of individual success stories that result from notably high performance. A third of all grades achieved are 7 or above and one in five students will have opened their envelope to find a Grade 9! This "rare grade" (achieved by only 3% of students nationally in each subject) demonstrates performance above that of the old A*.

Two of our top performing students were Bea Connor with nine Grade 9s and one Grade 8, and Harry Adams with seven Grade 9s, one Grade 8 and two Grade 7s. Sam Carey obtained eight grade 9s, one Grade 8 and one Grade 7.

School Run

Please do not drive into Sawyers Hall Lane! I am sure a few of you have made that decision for yourselves already, but in case any of you are still driving in, please refrain from doing so. The road is dangerous and busy outside the school. Please drop your children off elsewhere and ask them to walk the last bit. Similarly, when picking up, perhaps ask them to walk to a local car park (Brentwood Centre or Sainsbury's) or Doddinghurst Road or Shenfield Road where there are plenty of places to park with no restrictions.

Bikes
