Mrs Lee, Head of Year 7 writes....

On Friday 3rd November the whole school was off timetable to take part in our Enrichment Day. These days are designed to focus on the wider personal development of students.

Year 7 were visited by the fire brigade delivering some important messages about road safety and how to stay safe around fireworks. Alongside this they tested their art skills and had first aid workshops learning key skills like CPR, the recovery position and how to use bandages.

Year 8 took part in an interesting science session where they learnt how salt could conduct electricity and how to turn a 1p coin silver! They also completed some 'escape room' style maths

problems and visited the Sion Chapel. They got a chance to see the building, meet some of the volunteers, had sessions with the staff to talk about what the chapel does for the community and listened to a summary of the Gospel. At the end they had some quiet time in the chapel to reflect on what they had learnt and take time to pray.

Year 9 had a session with the Army, talking about career options and skills that lead to success in life. They then took part in a number of command tasks where they had to work as a team to solve problems. They were put to the test on the trading floor with Mr Fenn in a challenge where they had to buy and sell stocks to make the biggest profit possible. Their final session of the day looked at the

The staff from Elevate left this message for our students:


It was a pleasure presenting at Becket Keys School. The students were so engaged and enthusiastic.



House music is a music competition between the six houses at Becket Keys.


The final was this afternoon in the Main Hall and we were joined by a number of parents and carers who enjoyed the musical selections.


Meet Skulduggery Pleasant: detective, magician, warrior. Oh yes, and dead.

Pursued by evil forces intent on recovering a mysterious key, Stephanie finds help from an unusual source - the wisecracking skeleton of a dead wizard.


Will evil win the day? Will Stephanie and Skulduggery stop bickering long enough to stop it? One thing's for sure: evil won't know what's hit it.







Kyle realises that he isn't the only one who has buried fears and, more importantly, he now burns with the desire to live, and to live without fear. But will Death release him?


When Jonathan Harker visits Transylvania to help Count Dracula with the purchase of a London house, he makes a series of horrific discoveries about his client.







Frida Kahlo

Frida Kahlo was born in Mexico in 1907 her mother was Mexican and her dad was Cuban. Like the rest of her family she was poor. This led one of her legs shorter than the other and she had a limp.

Frida Kahlo is often people hope because she never gave up despite her many injuries and difficulties.

“What did I need you for when I have wings”

There was a bus accident in 1925 and Frida suffered some really bad injuries. During the 3 months in hospital, Frida painted lots of little colorful self-portraits of herself and her family.

Frida married Diego Rivera in 1929. They lived together in different parts of Mexico for 10 years but then divorced. Soon after they remarried again.

FRIDA KAHLO

Frida Kahlo has been a muse in art. In 25 she was badly hurt in a bus accident here many of her bones were broken. During her lifetime Frida had to have 35 operations help with her spinal injuries, and she is still chronic pain from the accident.

During her life, Frida created 153 paintings including 55 self-portraits. Kahlo said, "I paint myself because I am so often alone and because in the end I know best."

It was only several years after her death that her work became well-known and her reputation grew in the 1940s and reached what some critics call "Fridoman" by the 21st century.




