## Mr Scott-Evans, Headteacher writes.....

Dear Parents, Staff, and Students,

I am delighted to share with you the wonderful experience we had this week with our guests from Inner Mongolia. As part of our work with the **Global School Alliance**, our participation in the **Mandarin Excellence Programme** and our status as a **Confucius Classroom**, we had the pleasure of hosting 22 Chinese students between the ages of 11 and 16.

Our Chinese guests were paired with students of the same age and sex and participated in various lessons and clubs throughout the week. They also enjoyed lunch with their buddies and had the opportunity to explore the local area. The week was filled with exciting events, including an opening ceremony with music, gymnastics, and speeches, and a closing ceremony where the Chinese students presented a traditional song. We also awarded certificates and gifts to all the students who participated.

Our Chinese guests were accompanied by five teachers, and we had the pleasure of teaching all 27 of them how to make a traditional English cream tea. We baked scones and enjoyed them with cream and jam. We also took them for a walk to Brentwood High Street, where we visited St Thomas' Church and the chapel ruins. We then went to some of the shops, including Boots and Sainsburys.

## **Mid-Year Reports**

Next week, if you are a parent of a Year 7-9 (Key Stage 3) student, you will be receiving a mid-year report. These reports are designed to help parents and students know whether they are 'above track', 'on track' or 'below track' in each of their curriculum subjects.

Students arrive to us with a score from primary school. We convert this into a personal target that students should aim to achieve by the end of the year. Teachers are continuously assessing how students are doing against these targets. Are they listening in class? Contributing to class discussions? Presenting work beautifully? Completing classwork and homework to a high standard? Together with assessment data, we are able to make holistic judgements about whether students are 'on track' to meet end of year target grades.

At Key Stage 3, we assess students using 'stages'. Each curriculum area has worked with our expert trust to generate meaningful stage ladders that students should progress through. The stage ladders and a very informative video by Mr Scott-Evans explaining stages and assessment at Key Stage 3 can be found on our website <u>Becket Keys</u>. The stages are what we generate target grades against.

Another interesting feature of our website is the ability to see our entire curriculum online! This

means that you can see what your son or daughter is about to study next in each subject and how students will be assessed. Have a look at the online curriculum here Becket Keys.

When students receive their report, it would be a good idea for parents and students to go through the report and discuss each subject. Where students are 'above track' or 'on track' – fabulous! Students should continue being excellent students in order to meet expectations at the end of the year. Where students are 'below track' - it would be useful to reflect on this. Am I working hard enough? Is my book a true reflection of my ability? Am I handing homework in on time? Am I listening and contributing regularly to the lesson? If students (and parents) feel they are working hard enough, this is the time to ask for help. Contact your son or daughter's teacher to ask for advice and support via the staff contact portal.

These mid-year reports are designed to keep you informed so that you can take action. Please remember that we want all students to succeed and are always here to help. There is still plenty of the year left to make it a success!

# BRENTWOOD FOODBANK HELPING LOCAL PEOPLE IN CRISIS

The Brentwood Foodbank have recently shared concerning statistics about rising hunger and hardship in our local community. There has been a 67% increase in the number of people needing support over the past year. Winter is proving to be difficult for many families who use their services. During 2023, Brentwood Foodbank provided 120,000 meals to Brentwood residents referred to them in crisis.



As a school, traditionally we have encouraged foodbank donations as part of our Harvest Festival offering. Considering the cost-ofliving crisis and this appeal for help, we are now committed to encouraging and coordinating donations on a more regular basis, beginning with a collection throughout February.

Staff, students, visitors and friends of Becket Keys, can bring their donations directly to the

collection point in Main Reception from **now until Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> February**. The current shortage items are listed below. The list also contains essential non-food items required by families:

## Sixth Form National Apprenticeship Week

Monday 5<sup>th</sup> February until Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> February is National Apprenticeship Week. Degree Apprenticeships are fabulous opportunities for students to continue their studies after A Levels, while gaining experience in the workplace. Degree apprenticeships take three to six years to complete, depending on the course level and degree pursued. Students spend most of their time working and also study part-time at university. Overall, they spend about 20% of their time studying vs. 80% of their time working.

### What we do at Becket Keys?

Many of our Year 13 students plan to apply to both university and for apprenticeships so they have the most choices presented to them on A Level results day. A minority have selected to go for apprenticeships only. Alongside our UCAS application support, we support our Year 13 students applying for apprenticeships throughout the year, by sending them a great variety of apprenticeship opportunities, arranging alumni presentations, mock interviews, delivering talks about apprenticeships, providing references and by facilitating their apprenticeship interviews on site or at home.

However, our work supporting apprenticeship applications starts in Year 12. During this National Apprenticeship Week Year 12 students will be learning about

the different types of apprenticeships, advantages and disadvantages of apprenticeships, how to find an apprenticeship, upcoming events and how to prepare so that they are ready to apply in Year 13.

Our apprenticeship work does not stop after National Apprenticeship week finishes. Our apprenticeship introduction in Year 12 includes hosting visiting and virtual speakers, a UCAS exhibition visit, weekly drop-in sessions, support on how to start looking and enrichment lessons on CVs, covering letters and interview skills. We also arrange mock interviews and forward to student apprenticeship opportunities.




