#### Mr Scott-Evans writes......

Dear Parents/Carers

It is survey time again! Each year we ask students, parents and carers to give us feedback on their experience of Becket Keys. Each year we then meet with some groups of students and parents to listen in more detail and follow up on what we learn from the survey.

You can see what parents said last year about Becket Keys here. Firstly, you will see that only 98 parents responded last year. We would really like to get more responses this year. We know that these forms tend to be filled in by those who feel strongly about things and the silent majority tend to remain silent. We would love to hear more people have their say this year!

Last year, 96% of those who responded said their child was happy at school, 93% said that their child did well at our school. Whilst we are delighted that the majority are so happy, we do always focus on the ones who are not, and we try to think about how we can improve further for the benefit of all.

We look carefully at the survey to see what the areas of development should be and how they fit with other metrics. For example, last year 6% of parents who responded said that they strongly disagreed with the statement that the school informed them of how well their son/daughter was doing. When we spoke to families, we learned that this included not knowing how students conducting themselves, so we opened up a

new feature of the MCAS app to include more feedback to parents in this regard. We have also further extended the length of parents' evening appointments for sixth formers to provide better opportunities to hear how students are getting on. We also are trialing a different method of reporting to see if it helps parents to feel better informed. With additional short reports being sent home earlier in the year. If this is seen to be helpful, we will look to extend it across other year groups.

We were pleased that only 1% of those who responded strongly disagreed that their child does well at Becket Keys. With our best exam results last year placing us as the top performing mixed comprehensive school in Essex, I think we should see similar good data on that again this year. We will continue to employ great teachers, plan excellent lessons, and support students to realise their full potential.

However, last year, 14% of parents told us that they were not aware of the curriculum that was being taught to their son/daughter! We took that on board and have been trying to draw attention to the curriculum on our website – <a href="here">here</a>. Every subject, for every year group for every term is available on the school website. You can see week by week what is being taught. We know that it really helps most parents with planning day trips, theatre visits, books to read and

films to watch. We have also worked hard on making the most of the Satchel One app and parents tell us that they have learned a lot about what students are studying through this. I hope that parents feel better informed.



We also saw last year that although many parents agreed there were lots of clubs for students, you wanted to see us doing more to support the students' wider personal development. Nearly 20% said that they either did not know or were not happy enough with this. Speaking to parents afterwards, we learned that we needed to do more with parents, communicating more about what is happening with regards to wider personal development. We are also trying to give students more careers input, more opportunities to play for school teams, go one school trips and be in a school play/choir. We are now not only back to pre-pandemic levels but far surpassing them. We have never had so many opportunities nor had such excellent student engagement. Our Sixth Formers have particularly embraced this and are taking responsibility to either

help restore previous provision or run new clubs that they wish they had been able to access when they were in the lower school. The Sixth Formers benefit from taking this responsibility, and younger students benefit from interacting with them.

We have also seen great investment in PE, Music and Drama in the last year. For example, there are new Apple Macs, keyboards and instruments for music and more opportunities to perform than ever. We had our most ambitious school play ever 'School of Rock' - with more students taking part. We have continued to invest in more PE teachers, more opportunities to compete and extra clubs with new equipment in all areas.

I appreciate it is hard for families to fill in forms like these when most of us have never experienced another secondary school. Being typical Becket Keys parents we also all have very high expectations! However, please do try to be realistic and fair with your responses. We want to encourage our staff and recognise the effort they put in. These surveys give an opportunity for that: please give credit where credit is due.

# **Geography Department**

This year, due to increased numbers of students electing to take GCSE Geography we decided to head up to Cumbria and the Lake District National Park to explore a different part of the UK.

We were fortunate to have great weather on our first day and we able to take part in many rewarding team and character-building activities before we got into the Geography on day two. There were some notable achievements, with students going beyond their comfort zones and reaching the tops of the climbing walls, Jacob's Ladder and setting land speed records crossing the 'lava' fields.

On the second day half of the party investigated the River Eea, and how the width, depth and velocity altered downstream. We use systematic sampling and collected valuable data to investigate later in the day back in the classrooms in preparation for Paper 3 mocks back at school.

The other half of the group went into Barrow in Furness and to Walney Island to investigate urban deprivation and quality of life and contrast areas of the settlement. We also tried to catch a glimpse of the nuclear submarine at the BEA construction docks but the best we got was a view of it in the Maritime Museum on the day.







We had a very enjoyable and memorable trip. Thank you to all of those involved.



## Book of the Month - March








