Mrs Dowsett writes:

This week we have recognised Neurodiversity Celebration Week at Becket Keys. The purpose of the week is to help the world to understand, value and celebrate the talents of neurodiverse minds.

Throughout the week I have been sharing with Becket Keys staff and students extracts from books, both fiction and non-fiction, that focus on the topic of neurodiversity. I was inspired to do this by the sad passing of Benjamin Zephaniah. Zephaniah's life was varied, and his career included being a poet, actor, author and campaigner.

However, his path was not an easy one. Zephaniah left school aged 13 unable to read or write and he later found out he was dyslexic aged 21 when attending an adult education college. Despite these challenges, he did not let these barriers hold him back from success and achievement.

Zephaniah found himself a champion of children who struggled with dyslexia and he encouraged them to embrace and celebrate the skills that neurodiverse people can bring to society. He wrote in *Creative* Successful Dyslexic. 23 High Achievers Share Their Stories: "Having dyslexia can make you creative. If you want to construct a sentence and can't find the word you are searching for, you have to think of a way to write round it. This requires being creative and so your "creativity muscle" gets bigger."

In Corinthians Chapter 12 verses 12-14 the Bible says: "Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ." God created the world and its people to be unique and diverse. He blessed us with different skills and

In December 2023 a famous poet, actor, author and campaigner named Benjamin Zephaniah died.
Zephaniah left school aged 13 unable to read or write and he found out he was dyslexic aged 21. Despite this he did not let his barriers hold him back.





Benjamin Zephaniah wrote in Creative Successful Dyslexic. 23 High Achievers Share Their Stories:

Having dyslexia can make you creative. If you want to construct a sentence and can't find the word you are searching for, you have to think of a way to write round it. This requires being creative and so your "creativity muscle" gets bigger.

Kids come up to me and say, "I'm dyslexic too," and I say to them, "Use it to your advantage, see the world differently. Us dyslexic people, we've got it going on – we are the architects. We are the designers."





In the book *Can You See Me*? the main character is Tally an Autistic girl.


Tally says

"They make it look so easy. Maybe life is simply if you're the same as everyone else. Maybe they don't have to plan everything in advance and figure out what they might say in reply to a hundred questions or what their face is supposed to look like when they feel excited or happy or surprised or scared. Maybe they never feel scared."

"Don't be scared," Tally whispers. "Can you see me?"
She used to ask this question all the time when she was younger. Every time she put on the mask. And she was never quite sure what she wanted the answer to be. Whether it was better to be hidden or to be seen."

Higashida was diagnosed with Autism when he was five years old and has limited verbal communication skills. When he was 13 years old, he wrote his book *The Reason I Jump* using a communication board with help from his mother.

He writes, "I've learnt that every human being, with or without disabilities, needs to strive to do their best, and by striving for happiness you will arrive at happiness. For us, you see, having autism is normal -- so we can't know for sure what your 'normal' is even like. But so long as we can learn to love ourselves, I'm not sure how much it matters whether we're normal or autistic."

GCSE Awards Celebration

Last night we celebrated with our Year 11 cohort from 2023 at our Annual GCSE Awards Evening. Students were presented with their exam certificates and their RET Ebacc Certificates. This group of students were our highest performing yet, both in terms of progress and attainment. Our 2023 cohort demonstrated excellent character throughout Year 11 and we had exceptionally high expectations of them.



Our GCSE awards evening rightly celebrated outstanding individual performance. Bea Connor achieved nine Grade 9s and she is now studying Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics and Further Mathematics at Becket Keys. Sam Carey achieved eight Grade 9s one Grade 8, and one Grade 7, he is also at Becket Keys studying Mathematics, Further Mathematics, Physics and Music.

The progress awards were given to Greta Rockute (unable to attend the evening), Arissa Malik and Connie Gibson. These students were those who made the most progress during their time at Becket Keys, this award is about the distance travelled.



However, we also recognised the achievement of the whole cohort. This year a greater number of students than ever before achieved Grades 4-9 in both English and Maths. In addition a record number of students were entered for and passed the Ebacc. This will continue to go up and up as more and more students now sit a language as a GCSE.

At Becket Keys students are well ahead of the average student in Essex. That takes significant hard work and everyone should be proud of what we are doing here. As you can tell, I am incredibly proud of this group, and I was on a real high last night celebrating with them! Mrs Noble shared some of her memories and created a video of clips and photos from over the years.

Becket Keys cares about the grades, we care about what students go on to do, but what



we care about most is a student's Christian Character and faith. Our final two awards were given with this in mind: Matthew Stephens and Sophie Booth were chosen to receive the Outstanding Character Awards. Two very worthy winners from a year group where there were many more who could also have won.




Apprenticeship and traineeship vacancies

Mandarin Excellence Programme



Reggie's busy brain makes it hard for him to follow rules and make friends, plus his mum and teachers seem constantly weary about his erratic, high-energy ways. But when he sees a hypnotist perform on stage at the holiday park he visits, Reggie becomes *obsessed* with learning the skills of mind control - and he discovers he has an incredible talent for it! He's sure this will be his passport to popularity.

First of all he hypnotises the dog to think he's a frog, then makes his headmaster cluck like a chicken in assembly in front of the whole school - but then a group of mean kids supposedly take him under their wing and make him use his hypnosis talents for bad: stealing a chocolate bar from a shop and escalating to a bigger theft. Reggie must decide to use his skills for good only and come to trust his own brain to make decisions.


