#### Dear Parents/Carers

I wanted to write to you today let you know how the Parent Survey has gone this year year. However, so far, we have only had 28 families take part. I hope the lack of response is indicative of general satisfaction, but I would really like to get more views if possible. It is hard to draw conclusions from such a small sample.

We want to know if your child is happy and doing well in your opinion.

We look carefully at the survey to see what the areas of development should be and how they fit with other metrics. For example, last year 6% of parents who responded said that they strongly disagreed with the statement that the school informed them of how well their son/daughter was doing. This year none have strongly disagreed, but with it being such a small sample, it is hard to be sure what you think!

I hop that this improvement is because we have opened up a new feature of the MCAS app to include more feedback to parents in this regard. We have also further extended the length of parents' evening appointments for sixth formers to provide better opportunities to hear how students are getting on. We also are trialling a different method of reporting to see if it helps parents to feel better informed. With additional short reports being sent home earlier in the year. As this is seen to be helpful, we will look to extend it across other year groups next year.

We were pleased that only 1% of those who responded last year strongly disagreed that their child does well at Becket Keys. This year (so far) none of those who have responded have strongly disagreed. With our best exam results last year placing us as the top performing mixed comprehensive school in Essex, I think we should score well in this category. We will continue to employ great teachers, plan excellent lessons, and support students to realise their full potential.



Last year, 14% of parents told us that they were not aware of the curriculum that was being taught to their son/daughter; this year o% have said this! We took on board the feedback from last year and we have been trying to draw attention to the curriculum on our website – here. Every subject, for every year group, for every term is here. You can see week by week what is being taught. We know that it really helps most parents with planning day trips, theatre visits, books to read and films to watch. We have also worked hard on making the most of the Satchel One app and parents tell us that they have learned a lot about what students are studying through this. I hope

that parents feel better informed. We will continue to work on this.



We also saw last year that although many parents agreed there were lots of clubs for students, you wanted to see us doing more to support the students' wider personal development. Nearly 20% said that they either did not know or were not happy enough with this. This year it is 15%. Speaking to parents afterwards, we learned we needed to do more with parents, communicating more about what is happening with regards to wider personal development. We are also trying to give students more careers input, more opportunities to play for school teams, go one school trips and be in a school play/choir. We are now not only back to prepandemic levels but far surpassing them. We have never had so many opportunities nor had such excellent student engagement. Our Sixth Formers have particularly embraced this and are taking responsibility to either help restore previous provision or run new clubs that they wish they had been able to access when they were in the lower school. The Sixth Formers benefit from taking this responsibility, and younger

students benefit from interacting with them.

We have also seen great investment in PE, Music and Drama in the last year. For example, there are new Macs, keyboards and instruments for music and more opportunities to perform than ever. We had our most ambitious school play ever 'School of Rock' - with more students taking part. We have continued to invest in more PE teachers, more opportunities to compete and extra clubs with new equipment in all areas.



I appreciate it is hard for families to fill in forms like these when most of us have never experienced another secondary school and we may feel that there is a limit to how much we know. Furthermore, we all have very high expectations (quite rightly)! However, please do try to be realistic and fair with your responses. We want to encourage our staff and recognise the effort they put in. These surveys give an opportunity for that: please give credit where credit is due.

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#### **World Challenge**

Becket Keys has been working with World Challenge since 2017. World Challenge is an organisation that offers unique and inspiring experiences for schools through various programmes. Here are some key aspects of World Challenge:

- Leadership Expeditions: These expeditions are student-led and focus on developing leadership skills.
- 2. Learning Service Journeys: These journeys are designed to foster global citizenship through cultural immersion. Students spend 7–13 nights in different countries, expanding their minds by sharing cultures and stepping out of their comfort zones.
- 3. Project Independence: For those who want to take the road less travelled, Project Independence offers independent trips with like-minded friends. It's an adventure of a lifetime for brave students.

On Tuesday, the World Challenge students met to take part in a culinary session. As part of the preparation for the summer trip to Borneo students were asked to

prepare the traditional Malaysian dish, Nasi Goreng. A great time was had by all, and the finished dishes looked fantastic.

The team thought other students might want to try making the dish themselves so here is the recipe.



## Cooking Corner: Nasi Goreng Recipe Ingredients:

1 teaspoon oil
Protein of your choice (chicken, prawns, or a vegetarian alternative)
Garlic and ginger (add chili if you like it spicy)
Stir-fry vegetables
Nasi Goreng paste
Noodles
Soy sauce (for seasoning)

#### Instructions:

Heat Things Up: Start by adding a teaspoon of oil to a pan and heating it up.

#### Protein Power:

Add your chosen protein to the pan. Cook it thoroughly until it's nicely browned.

Aromatic Flavours:

Throw in some minced garlic and grated ginger. If you are feeling adventurous, add a touch of chili for extra heat.

#### Veggie Vibes:

Stir in the colourful stir-fry vegetables. Keep them moving for 3 to 4 minutes, ensuring they stay crisp and vibrant.

Nasi Goreng Magic:

Now, it is time for the star ingredient: Nasi Goreng paste. Add it to the pan and let the flavours mingle.

#### Rice Time:

Toss in the rice (cooked beforehand, of course). Stir everything together for an additional 3 minutes.

Season to Perfection:

Season your Nasi Goreng with soy sauce. Adjust the seasoning to your taste.

Egg-citing Finish:


Traditionally, Nasi Goreng is served with a fried egg on top. But hey, if you prefer a thin omelette, go for it!

This is a murder mystery novel like no other.




terrifying journey which will turn his whole world upside down.


#### Murder Most Unladylike Robin Stevens



#### This Lie Will Kill You Chelsea Pitcher




#### This Book Kills Ravena Guron


#### What I Saw and How I Lied Judy Blundell


## You're Not Supposed to Die Tonight

#### **UKMT Mathematics Challenge**

On Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> April, a selection of our Year 7 and 8 students (122 on the day) took part in the 2024 UKMT Junior Mathematical Challenge. This is an annual event and is a lovely enrichment opportunity. The questions themselves are all non-calculator, but students are allowed to use pen and paper for their working out. All questions are multiple choice – and one of the questions from 2023 is above.

Papers from the challenge will be uploaded to UKMT for machine marking, and we hope to get results back in 2 to 3 weeks.

Correct answers for questions 1 to 15 score 5 and 16 to 25 score 6 (so

the maximum score available is 135). All students who took part will receive a certificate. The top 50% across the UK will be awarded either Bronze, Silver or Gold in the ratio 3:2:1. Top performing students may then be invited to participate in the next round ("Junior Kangaroo" or for an exceptional few the "Junior Olympiad"). The next rounds usually take place in June.

We wish our Year 7 and 8 students well, and hope they enjoyed the experience!




#### Our School Library (Lib A)

To our kind supporters,


