Heavenly Father, we pray that Becket Keys Church of England School will be a blessing to the people of Brentwood.


Encouraged by the example of Peter, Thomas of Canterbury and all your saints, may its students know the beauty of your truth;

Charity Update – I Got Shoes

As you are aware, the school is supporting 'I Got Shoes' a charity set up by Penny and Gary Seithel six years ago. They have recently visited Uganda to see the work that their charity is supporting, and they have sent us this update.



What a wonderful gift to be back in Uganda again with our students, teachers, and staff. As we walked into the school hall, the choir was in full celebration mode. With this welcome, we were expected to make our way directly to the front. Yet, I couldn't help but pause, not wanting to miss this beautiful moment.

I stood in the back, taking it all in. My thoughts raced back to our first visit here in 2018. Gary and I were teaching leadership courses in Kampala, and our site leader, Ben, asked us to visit a slum outside the city called Kyebando. (Pronounced 'chey-band-o'). He pastored a small church right in this community. We met the families who were praying and believing for a school their children could attend. Nothing was further from our radar.

And now, seeing all that has transpired in the past six years ...

Our partner described one family whose children are part of Jubilee Care Nursery & Primary School. A family with four children could not afford to send their children to school. They were seen in the

community constantly doing chores. Fetching water.
Gathering sticks. Not in school.
Our partners reached out to the family and said "Come, bring them to school." Just one of many lives you are helping.

I GOT SHOES has partnered with Jubilee for the past four years, and they are now developing





ways to build their own resources. It is exciting to see their growing initiatives and continued trust for God to meet every need. Families will offer to bring firewood to the school. Some can bring sugar. Others offer 'manilas' or 'reams of paper' for students to use. And more!

The idea is what a family can offer: they contribute. What is lacking, I GOT SHOES helps with. For example, teacher salaries, food, school uniforms, and shoes. When families 'bring something to the table', they feel ownership, pride in helping and gratitude for their children's access to education.




Our School Library (Lib A)




- Your school library is open on the following lunch times:
