Becket Keys opened in 2012 as a result of a local campaign led by Andy Scott-Evans and his colleague Iain Gunn. At the time, both were headteachers of Outstanding local Church of England primary schools and aware that there was no Outstanding Church of England secondary school for families in Brentwood.

They approached the Russell Education Trust (RET), a charitable education trust, to open Becket Keys. The RET was built on the expertise of the school improvement specialists, Education London. Being part of the RET helped Becket Keys to be judged Outstanding by OfSTED in 2014. Two years later, the school was also judged Outstanding by SIAMS - the Church of England's inspection service. Its first cohort of students sat their GCSE exams in 2017, achieving some of the best results in Essex. This success has continued with year-on-year improvements in GCSE exam results and, since 2019, in A Level results too.

Our Ethos

The motto of Becket Keys, 'Faith in Learning', is rooted in our Church of England background and is a firmly held view. In the broadest sense, we have faith in learning: it opens doors, changes lives and is the most wonderful thing we can do. Albert Einstein said: "I have no special talent, I am only passionately curious". Courses





Choosing the right courses is clearly crucial to success in the Sixth Form. For some of you, this will be easy as your talents lie in a particular area of the curriculum. For others, though, there could be a range of subjects, all of which appeal to you.

When you choose Becket Keys Sixth Form, or at least consider it, a member of staff will talk with you about your higher education and/or employment aspirations, then advise you about suitable courses in the Sixth Form. Nevertheless, this task is a shared one: if you have a particular university course in mind, then look at the entry requirements for a number of universities. Anyone wanting to study medicine, for example, will need A Levels in subjects like chemistry, biology and mathematics. If the course is less prescriptive - law, for example - then consider the sort of subjects in which you can demonstrate logical thinking, good communication skills or the ability to evaluate evidence.

Remember too that some courses are so over- subscribed that even having three A grades might not be enough to secure a place - so choosing a subject which you like, but do not usually score very highly in, could damage your chances of getting in.

These are exactly the kind of issues and options we will discuss with you before you make your final choice.

General Entry

Requirements

All students applying for a place at Becket Keys Church of England School should have a strong work ethic, high levels of academic interest and high expectations.

The Sixth Form is academic in nature and hence has high entry requirements.

Students must be in sympathy with the Christian ethos of the school and be prepared to give time to serve the school community.

Admission into the Sixth Form is open to students gaining a minimum entry qualification of at least eight 9-4 grades at GCSE (including at least Grade 5 in English and mathematics).

All students, internal and external, will be admitted onto three A Level programmes of study if they meet the entry requirements including the subject specific entry requirements for each subject. If a student studies a fourth subject, this is usually because it is further mathematics (although this can also be a student's third subject out of three).

Facilities

Our new Sixth Form facilities will provide you with a comfortable working environment. You will have a silent study room, with study booths, and an area for focused collaborative learning; both will give access to superfast Wi-Fi and mobile device charging for your continuous use. You will have your own Deli Bar, and a garden and decking area for relaxing in during your free time.

Responsibilities

Sixth Formers are the student leaders within our school. As such, we expect you not only to take responsibility for your own learning and development, but also to share with staff some of the responsibility for our thriving Christian community. We will expect you to choose a responsible role or post that serves the school as a whole and undertake training for that role during our Sixth Form induction. For example: playing a regular role in running assemblies and collective worship for the junior years; acting as a reading partner or mentor for a younger student; sharing with the staff the leadership of a club or society or school event. All of you will be appointed prefects. You will have the opportunity to take responsibility for shaping Becket Keys Sixth Form through participation in social and charitable activities and, if selected, as a representative on the Sixth Form Council or as a Senior Prefect.

Support and Guidance

There will be a team of people available to support you through your two years of study in the Sixth Form. Your form tutor, Head of Sixth Form and Assistant Heads of Sixth Form will all be there to help you deal with both the routine daily activities and any unexpected challenges that occur. They will work in conjunction with a dedicated admin team to ensure you receive the best possible guidance and support, including how to organise your time to meet a range of academic deadlines and how to understand the best university courses and employment options for the future. You will have access to counsellors, chaplains and clergy, should you wish to consult them. There is also a quiet chapel and prayer spaces, for all faiths.

Academic mentoring

Your subject teachers take the main responsibility, with you, for subject learning. But each student will also be part of a tutor group. Your tutor will have an overview of your progress in all subjects and support you with any issues that arise. Tutors are an integral part of Becket Keys' support and guidance – and your progress to university, training or employment.

You should combine your studies with a range of extra-curricular activities, some of which include:

- Volunteering opportunities
- · Mentoring younger students
- · Serving as a Prefect and Senior Prefect
- · Ski trip to Sugarloaf montain
- Freedom to organise your own trips to places that interest you
- Sports clubs and other sporting opportunities
- Student-led societies you are welcome to suggest new ones if you have a particular passion.

We are also running:

- The 'early entry' programme to support those applying for Oxbridge or wanting to be a medic, dentist or vet
- Learning skills sessions to support your transition from Year 11 to Year 12
- A structured enrichment programme, covering areas such as careers, life skills and mental and physical health
- Core religious studies lessons
- The BK6 TED Talks in which all students develop research, communication and presentation skills
- Trips to university open days, UCAS conferences and business apprenticeship events
- A wide variety of activities as part of the House Cup competition
- · Enrichment days including The London Challenge, Roadster and expert advice on writing personal statements
- · An 'Above and Beyond' profile for each student to record super curricular activities.
